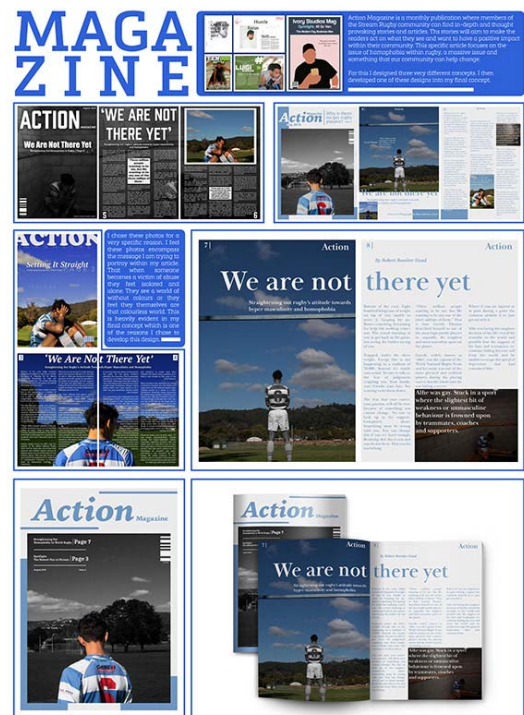
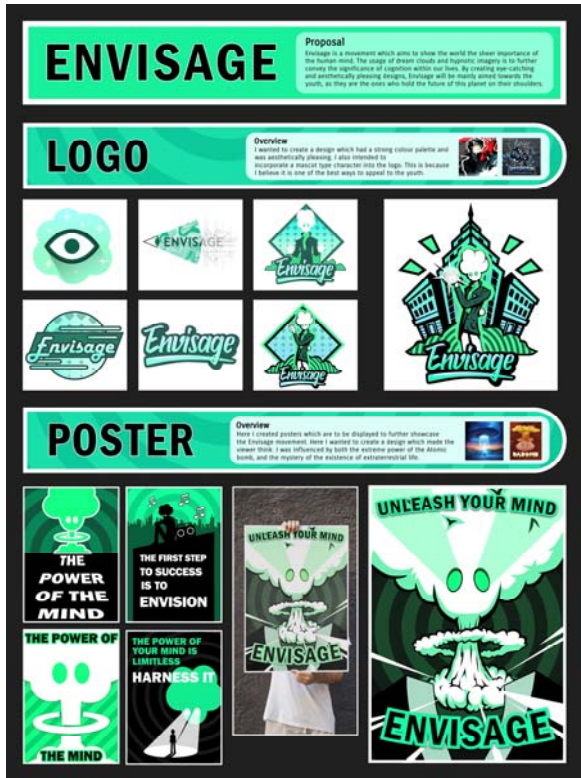
■ ART | DESIGN DEPARTMENT

What are attendance dues?

Attendance Dues are the compulsory property and insurance fee which you legally commit to pay when you enrol your child(ren) in a Catholic school. The dues are used to pay for the costs of new school classrooms, gymnasiums and other buildings, pay off existing mortgages and pay for the insurance on all school property.
