



Tena koutou katoa,

This year Vibe Youth Health Service started delivering immunisations, these include Boostrix, MMR, and moving forward the HPV (Gardisal) immunisation. We are emailing to let you know of our MMR (measles mumps and rubella) campaign. You may have seen this campaign advertised on radio or TV.

The key messages for this Ministry of health campaign are as follows:

- Aged 15 to 30? You might not be protected against measles.
- Measles can make you very sick and can be life-threatening.
- Measles is even more contagious than COVID-19.
- Protect against measles. Be a guardian of the future.
- Immunise to protect yourself and your whānau.
- Get your free measles immunisation.

The Ministry of Health has advised that anyone that has had or due to have a COVID 19 vaccine is also able to have MMR vaccination at the same time.

We would like to offer an MMR immunisation clinic at St Patrick's College for any students between the ages of 15-30yrs.
